Did You Know? The WGC's 2021 contribution to Girls on the Run (GOTR) of North Central West Virginia helped provide program materials and healthy snacks for 312 girls?! At GOTR, girls build friendships and empathy for others, they form a team where they are supported, accepted and encouraged and where they inspire each other to let their Star Power Shine! This season, GOTR participants used their star power to impact those in their community by cleaning up garbage, planting flowers, collecting donations and making cards for WVU Children's Hospital, gathering donations for a



local animal shelter, and painting encouraging words on rocks to leave around their town.

- **▼ Did you know** that the Mountain Stewardship and Outdoor leadership training helped to build and grow relationships with the local Hispanic population to aid in leadership connections, educational opportunities, and community building?
- **₱ Did you know** the WGC Endowment has reached over \$100,000 and we grant out 4% in immediate grant making each year to continue to help women and girls in North Central WV in perpetuity.
- Did you know that the WGC helped grantees, Pantry Plus More to stock feminine hygiene items and self-care products in our school pantries?
- Did you know the WGC helped to fund Libera Teen Groups in Preston and Taylor County and the Clarksburg-Harrison Public Library to tell their stories; identify the lies they believe about themselves and the barriers in their way; get connected to the truth of who they are, and their potential; and get connected to resources to help them live out their potential and overcome their barriers.?
- **Poid you know** that the WGC was founded in 2014? Just eight years and we've granted over \$104,000!!!
- **Did you know** that 60% of your annual gift to the WGC goes toward immediate grant-making in our community and 40% into the endowment fund?



- Poid you know that the WGC provided funding for the The Pinion Program through On Eagles Wings Therapeutic Horsemanship to help two young ladies participate in an eight-week program geared towards equine-assisted learning and wellness? The feedback from these two participants and their families was so positive that On Eagles' Wings made the determination to investigate ways to grow and expand the Pinion Program to reach more adolescent females!
- **Poid you know** that the WGC has helped over 20 different organizations' projects and programs specifically targeted to empower and encourage healthy development of women and girls and promote gender equity in our community!
